Marine College of Arts & Science, an educational institution, having its campus, 1, Canal Road, Gandhi Nagar, Behind Kottapattinam, Adyar, Chennai - 600028 hereinafter referred to as "Foundation College", which organization shall remain engaged to the extent shall meet and uphold its Board of Trustees, Officers of the OTHER PARTY.

"MLPI Foundation" and "Foundation College", are individually and collectively referred to as "Party" and "Parties" respectively.

In consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, understandings, and agreements between the Parties hereto, and with a view to record the terms and conditions that will govern the relationship for all amongst Parties, the Parties hereby come into this Agreement on the terms and conditions contained herein.

1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The purpose of this SUA is to clearly define the roles and responsibilities of each Party, to relation to volunteer program for the students through various initiatives.

2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF MLPI Foundation

MLPI Foundation shall undertake the following activities:

a. MLPI Foundation shall be responsible to have a section for the students on the importance and impact of volunteering and etc.

b. MLPI Foundation shall be responsible to give training to the student volunteers in the respective fields of Medical Clerwing, Patient Support, and Baby Donation Making.

c. MLPI Foundation shall be responsible to get permissions at hospitals across the city to train the above mentioned activities.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF PATRICIAN COLLEGE

Patrician College shall undertake the following activities:

- a. Patrician College to ensure the registered volunteers adhere to the rules and responsibilities as stated.
- b. Maintain a contact person, who shall coordinate with the MELPI Foundation team for planning, workshops, training sessions at hospitals.

4. RULES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF VOLUNTEERS

- a. Volunteers should commit to a period of 3 months. Only those completing 3 months will be awarded a certificate.
- b. The program will require volunteers to work 8 hours per week and a total of 24 hours for 3 months – (2 half's day per week or 1 full day per week – as per their convenience).

The site will mostly focus on the 4 activities as mentioned below:

1. Patient Engagement
 - a) Medical Chatting
 - b) Patient Pageantry
 - c) Radio Interview
2. Hospital/Patient Engagement
 - a) This involves activities like helping the patients (share their stories) with testimonials, showcasing from them the advancement process, medical ward/touring, guest lectures, living stories etc.
3. Caregivers Engagement
 - a) This involves, assessing the standards of the hospitalized patients in the selected target group (on/in a certain condition or what situation).

5. BENEFITS TO THE VOLUNTEERS

- a. Volunteers will be trained on social chattering, patient pageantry and making being thanked the day of exit.
- b. Certificates as a token will be given to all volunteers.
- c. Top performers will be given monetary remuneration for a suitable job role in MELPI.
- d. One employer with a great affiliation will be given (1 of 10K, 20K per day)
- e. MELPI Foundation benefits a share will be given for the longer runs.

2. **EFFECTIVE DATE AND SIGNATURE**

This MOU shall be effective from the date of execution of the MOU by the authorized officials of both the Parties. It shall be in force from the date of signature of the parties. Further this MOU shall remain effective and unrevoked by either party.

3. **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

Both the Parties shall refer to it, as subject to the use of or reference to any names, logos, trade names, trademarks or related intellectual property rights (Confidential Property) belonging to the other Party only in respect of applications for outreach of the events and related activities. All the Intellectual Property rights of the respective Party in the materials submitted by them to the other Party for publication in terms of this Agreement will remain their sole and exclusive property of that Party.

4. **CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION**



All information relating to Patanjali College, information of students and their personal details which may remain confidential or confidential information of Patanjali College shall hereinafter be referred to as "Confidential Information". MLPI Foundation will not disclose, either directly or indirectly, any Confidential Information it may acquire in any manner and undertake to use all Confidential Information disclosed exclusively in accordance with the provision of this Contract/MOU.

5. **JURISDICTION LAW**

This Contract shall be governed by and in accordance with the laws of India. Exclusive jurisdiction for this Contract is subject to the Court of Mumbai, Maharashtra, India. The Courts at Delhi shall have exclusive jurisdiction (subject to the arbitration proceedings which are to be also conducted at Delhi/Catnach) over any or all disputes arising out of this MOU and the parties hereby submit themselves to the jurisdiction of such Courts and/or Tribunals.

6. **DISPUTE RESOLUTION MECHANISM**

If any dispute, difference or claim arises between the parties in connection with this agreement or the validity, interpretation, implementation or alleged breach of this Agreement or anything done, omitted to be done pursuant to this Agreement, the parties shall endeavor to resolve the same through consultation and negotiation. The plan for such amicable settlement shall only be Mutual Settlement. If the dispute is not resolved through consultation and negotiation within 30 days after commencement of such consultation or within such period thereafter as mutually agreed in writing, then the Parties may refer the dispute for resolution to a Sole Arbitrator, to be appointed by the Parties. In the event the parties are unable to agree to a common venue for appointment of a Sole Arbitrator, then such Party shall appoint one Arbitrator and the said two arbitrators so appointed by the parties shall appoint a third Arbitrator. Such arbitrator shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The statutory classification of an arbitrator for the first time is in force. The arbitration shall be in English Language. The venue of arbitration shall be Mumbai. The cost of such Arbitration shall be borne equally by both the parties.

The Parties agree that Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws in force in India and in the eventuality of any dispute or difference (including in the eventuality of violation of the agreement by any party) should arise on any matter relating to or arising out of the present agreement the same shall be referred to the sole arbitrator of an arbitrator to be appointed jointly by the HOD of MDW Department and CEO of MLPI Foundation, whose decision shall be final and binding upon the parties. The sole Arbitrator shall conduct the arbitration proceedings at Chennai, Bangalore only. It is also mutually agreed between the parties that the Parties would be entitled to invoke the present Arbitration Clause/agreement during or even after the continuance and even after the present Agreement has expired or been terminated etc.

In the event of such an Arbitrator in whom the matter has been originally referred dying or being unable/reluctant to act for any reason whatsoever and/or withdrawing from his/her office at any stage, a replacement will be appointed jointly by the HOD of MDW Department and CEO of MLPI Foundation shall be entitled to appoint another person to act as the sole arbitrator. That such arbitrator shall be entitled to proceed with the reference from the stage at which it was left by his/her predecessor. It is also agreed between the parties that arbitration proceedings would be conducted in English only and in no other language.

In any case, neither party will make any such joint / media statement or may be detrimental to the interests of the other party.

12. **EXIT CLAUSE**

Either Party may issue a 30-days prior written notice to each other party to terminate the agreement/POC. All legitimate monetary dues (if any) due to MLPI will have to be cleared before exit.




Their mission is to deliver quality education by engaging professional and relational communities for innovation, entrepreneurship, and capability development of students and to facilitate holistic development of students to be leaders, citizens, and socially responsible citizens with high values and ethics.</p>	
<p>2. PURPOSE</p> <p>The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between IRCPCF and Pacific College is to build professional and personal relationships of IRCPCF and Pacific College students to engage with child patients and families serving life-threatening diseases.</p>	
<p>3. FURTHER RELATIONSHIP</p> <p>Each organization agrees on the terms and conditions of this MOU to acknowledge and complement the other to coordinate palliative care activities. Existing bodies shall be kept informed but no exclusive relationship between the institutions. Each institution shall be free to enter into memoranda of understanding under agreements with other entities. Both organizations acknowledge the "beneficiality of the partnership".</p>

COMMITMENT</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> IRCPCF commits to undertake the following activities to build competency of IRCPCF and Pacific College students: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Capacity building activities including emergency governmental training workshop. Clinical courses will have 30 hours of theory and practical sessions/Programme will be a blend of virtual and offline sessions, guided by professionals in the field of Pediatric Palliative Care. Courses will be provided to American. There will be a focus of theoretical disease in offline mode and in-house of online or virtual sessions. Patients will have to be referred to students who complete courses. Resident people will be referred for the online and offline courses. For students for virtual courses IRCPCF will - 100% will be charged per patient for registration, training, and certificate cost. IRCPCF facilities - 100% per session because of registration, training, and certificate cost, healthcare of all stakeholders will be taken. This MOU may be renewed automatically in writing, signed by both parties. Otherwise, it shall be renewed automatically. Incomplete periods of 3 years, unless agreed upon in writing.</p>
