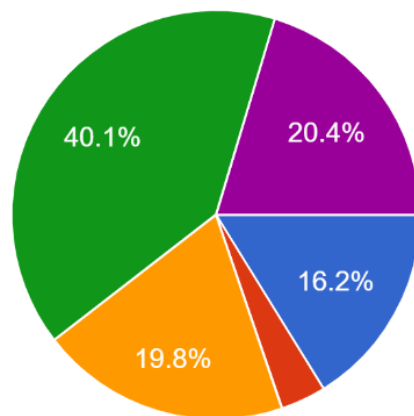

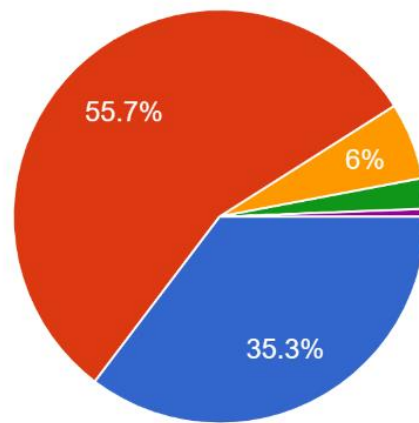

- Have open mind and listen to other's views.

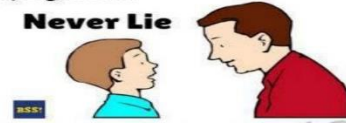


Story telling

 - It ends with a period or an exclamation mark.(. Or !)

 4. Stop the car immediately.
 5. Enjoy this delicious meal.

Interrogative sentences

- It is to ask questions.
 - Always ends with a question mark.
