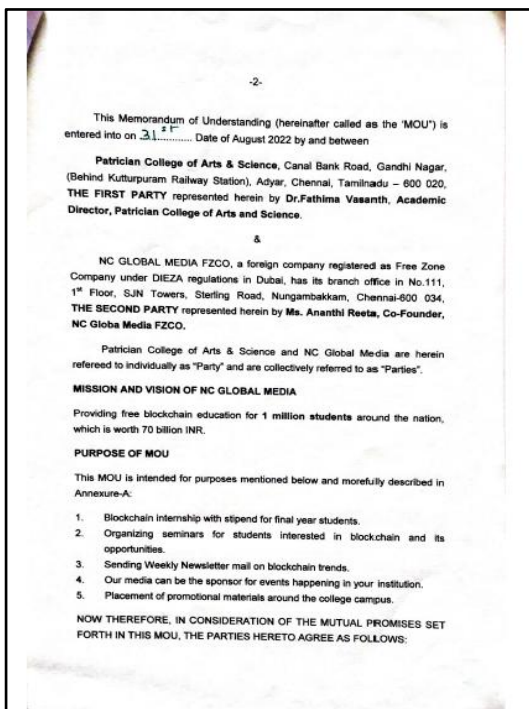
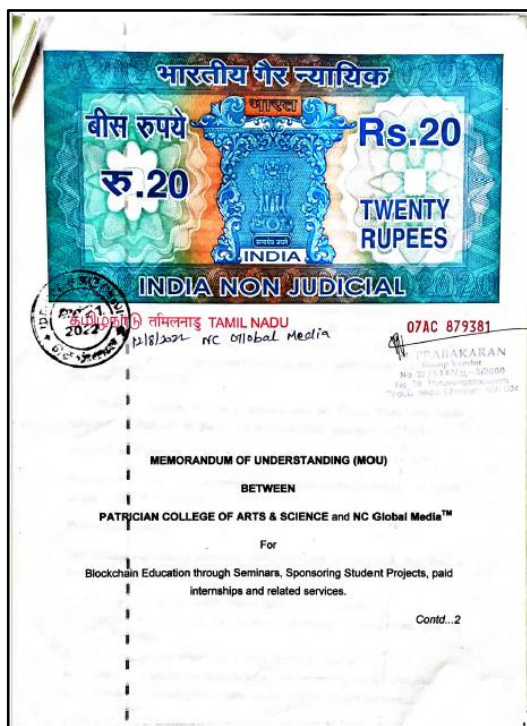

3.5. Collaborative Activities

Clause 1

CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both parties are united by common interests and objectives of educating students about the Blockchain Technology, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations. The parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 The cooperation between First Party and Second Party will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the Second Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching/ training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the First Party.

Clause 2

SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be a major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 The Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching/ training methodology so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.
- 2.3 The interaction between Industry and Student Center will give an insight into the latest developments/ requirements of the industries. The Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit its group companies and also be involved in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The industrial training and exposure provided to students through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide its Labor/ Workshop/ Industrial Sites for the hands-on training of the learners enrolled with the First Party.
- 2.4 The Second Party will train the students of the First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the gap in skill and make them ready for industry.
- 2.5 The Second Party will extend the necessary support to deliver guest lecturers to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.6 The Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs.
- 2.7 The Second Party expects the first party to engage all of the respective departments' students in the sessions/workshops conducted at the college campus.

Clause 3

VALIDITY

- 3.1 The validity of the agreement is one year from the date of agreement.
- 3.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

Clause 4

CONFIDENTIALITY

- 4.1 Patrician College and NC GLOBAL MEDIA hereby agree that in the course of achieving the purposes of this MOU, it may receive information that may be classified as "confidential information" which includes all proprietary information of either Party including but not limited to commercial, technical and artistic information relating to the other Party's establishment, business, operation, maintenance, marketing and promotion of its own services, experimental work, customers, clients of the other Party, financial information, marketing plans, business plans, project plans, information relating to sales, costs, operating income, organization, customer lists, price calculation models, software, technology, methods, documentation, designs and materials and general trade secrets of the other Party and Intellectual Property of the other Party, as well as any other information labeled "Confidential" by the other Party or accessible to or provided to the other Party, whether protected under law or not, and shall apply irrespective of the form in or the media on which such information is displayed or contained. The Parties hereby agree and undertake that it shall take all steps as may be required to protect the confidential information of the other Party and that it will execute such confidentiality agreements as may be required by any Party from time to time.

Clause 5

REPRESENTATION AND WARRANTIES

- 5.1 Each Party represents and warrants to the other Party that they are under no legal or lawful restrictions, hindrance or encumbrances of any nature, which in any manner restricts the performance of obligations of the Parties under this MOU.
- 5.2 Each Party hereby states and agrees that they have not, and will not, in the course of performing under this MOU:
 - a) violate the applicable Anti-Bribery Laws and regulations, including the Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 and the Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002;
 - b) offer, promise, give or authorize the giving of any bribe, rebate, payoff, influence payment, kickback or other unlawful payment including facilitation payments, to any Public Official in order to obtain or retain business, gain any unfair advantage or influence any act or decision of a Public Official in connection with the MOU and/or its business;
 - c) if or any of its affiliates, group companies, sub-contractors, agents, or representative breaches this representation and/or is charged with or investigated in relation to or engages in any conduct that may constitute an offense under laws related to Anti-Bribery or Sanctions, the other Party and its subsidiaries shall have the right to terminate this MOU or to take other appropriate action in accordance with the terms of this MOU.
- 5.3 Each Party hereby represents and warrants that:
 - a) it is duly constituted, validly existing and in good standing under the laws of India and has all requisite corporate power and authority to enter into and perform its obligations under this MOU;
 - b) it is in compliance with all applicable laws and has obtained and shall continue to maintain all required registrations, approvals, permissions and consents under applicable laws during the Term.

Clause 6

INDEMNITY

- 6.1 Patrician College hereby represents and warrants to NC GLOBAL MEDIA that in the event any suits, claims, disputes or such differences are brought directly against NC GLOBAL MEDIA by any third party as a consequence of breach of the terms and conditions of this MOU or on account of the willful misconduct or any negligent act by Patrician College, then Patrician College shall indemnify and hold NC GLOBAL MEDIA harmless from and against all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including any direct costs, loss, damages suffered by NC GLOBAL MEDIA and Patrician College shall at its sole cost assist NC GLOBAL MEDIA in defending such suits, claims, disputes or differences.

Clause 7

LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 7.1 Subject to terms of this MOU, in no event shall either Party be liable for any indirect, incidental, consequential, punitive or special damages, loss of profits, loss of data, or interruption of business, whether such damages are alleged in tort or contract, even if the other Party has been advised of the possibility of such damages. Notwithstanding anything contained herein under this MOU, the total liability of NC GLOBAL MEDIA arising out of this MOU shall not exceed moneys paid by NC GLOBAL MEDIA and received by Patrician College.
- 7.2 Nothing in this MOU shall exclude or limit the liability of Patrician College in case of any claims arising out of:
 - (i) willful misconduct or gross negligence leading to death or bodily injury or damage to property; or
 - (ii) breach of confidentiality obligations; (iii) infringement of intellectual property rights; or
 - (iv) any loss which by law cannot be excluded or limited.

Clause 8

DISPUTE RESOLUTION

- 8.1 This MOU shall be interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of India.
- 8.2 Any dispute arising out of or in connection with this MOU shall be referred to Arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. Both the Parties will mutually appoint a Sole Arbitrator and the decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding. The arbitration proceedings shall be in the English language and shall be held in Chennai. This does not preclude the Parties from approaching the courts of India for any injunctive relief.
- 8.3 The courts in Chennai shall have exclusive jurisdiction over any dispute, difference or claims arising out of or in connection of this MOU.

Clause 9

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- 9.1 Each Party will have absolute and sole rights on the intellectual property (including ideas, concepts, creations, discoveries, domain names, inventions, improvements, know how, trade or business secrets; trademarks, service marks, designs, utility models, patents, copyright and other confidential and proprietary information) developed independently during the program.

Clause 10

MISCELLANEOUS

- 10.1 **Entire MOU:** This MOU shall constitute the entire MOU between the Parties hereto relating to the subject matter thereof, and there are no oral statements, representations, warranties, undertakings or agreements between the Parties except as provided herein. This MOU may not be amended or modified in any respect except by written instrument signed by the Parties hereto.
- 10.2 **Assignment:** Neither Party may assign its rights or delegate its duties under this MOU either in whole or in part without the prior written consent of the other Party. Any attempted assignment or delegation without such consent will be void.
- 10.3 **Publication:** Each Party agrees to keep the existence and nature of this MOU confidential and any announcement or circular relating to the existence or the subject matter of this MOU shall first be approved by both Parties as to its content, form and manner of publication.
- 10.4 **Notices:** Any notices under this MOU will be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, to the respective address of Parties as contained in this MOU. Such notice will be effective upon its mailing as specified.
- 10.5 **Waiver:** It is expressly understood that if one Party on any occasion fails to perform any term of this contract and the other Party does not enforce that term, the failure to enforce on that occasion shall not prevent enforcement on any other occasion.
- 10.6 **Severability:** Each section of this MOU is severable. If any provision is held unenforceable by a Several court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling shall not impair any other provision that remains intelligible and all other provisions shall continue in effect.

Clause 11

AMENDMENT OF MOU

- 11.1 The terms and conditions contained in this MOU may be amended or modified with the mutual consent in writing of both parties.

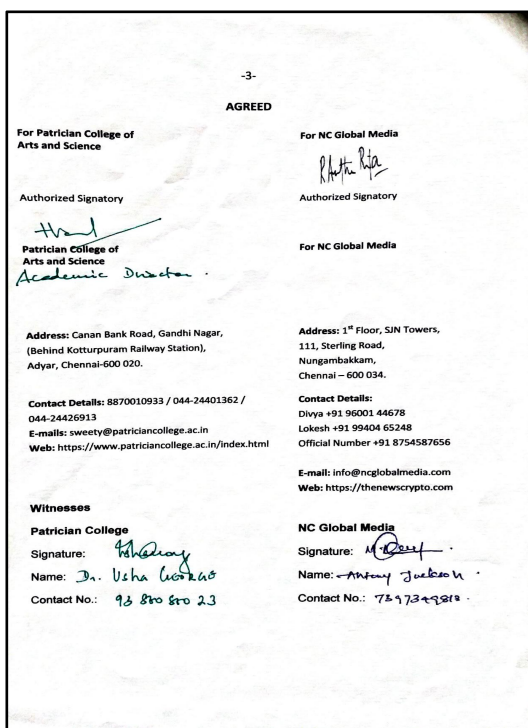
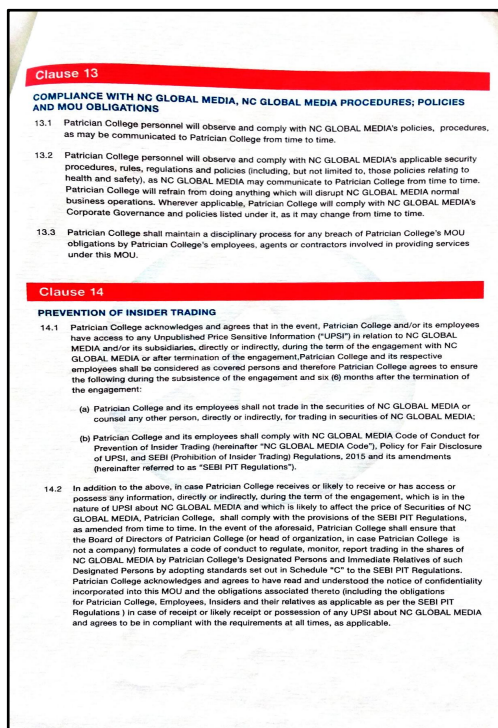
Clause 12

FORCE MAJEURE

- 12.1 Any delays in or failure of performance by any Party under this MOU shall not constitute default hereunder if and to the extent caused by Force Majeure, which is defined to be occurrences beyond the control of the Party affected, including but not limited to acts of the government authorities, epidemics and pandemics, acts of God, fire, flood, explosion, riots, war, rebellion, insurrection, sabotage and non-cooperation of third parties, if such event causes or is reasonably anticipated to cause delay in performance for more than fifteen (15) days, then the either Party may terminate this MOU, effective upon written notice to the other.
- 12.2 If such event causes or is reasonably anticipated to cause delay in performance for more than fifteen (15) days, then the either Party may terminate this MOU, effective upon written notice to the other. Patrician College shall return to NC GLOBAL MEDIA all any unutilized/unused grants that may have been released by the NC GLOBAL MEDIA in case of termination due to Force Majeure.

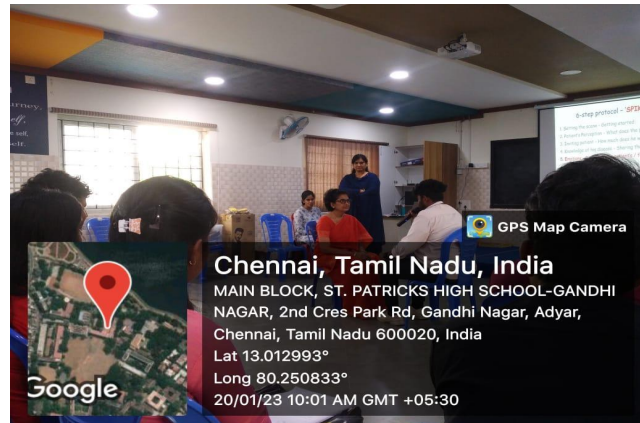
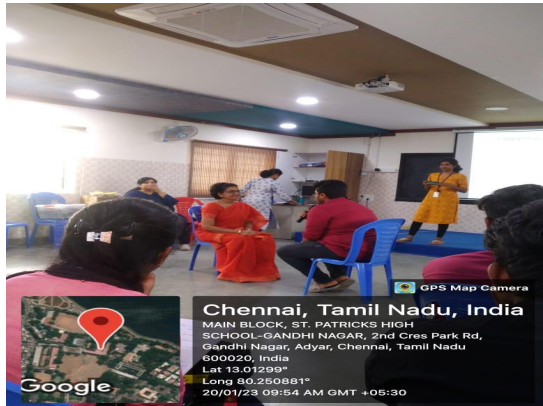
ABOUT DAY 2 :
