Introduction:

Creative thinking is an essential skill that drives innovation, problem-solving, and progress in various fields. The resource person addressed invaluable insights into the processes and techniques that enhance creativity and foster an environment conducive to innovative ideas.

Importance of Creative Thinking:

Creative thinking involves looking at problems or situations from a fresh perspective and suggesting unconventional solutions. It is crucial for:

- Innovation: Developing new products, services, and processes.
- Problem-Solving: Finding unique solutions to complex problems.
- Adaptability: Responding effectively to changing environments and challenges.
- Competitive Advantage: Differentiating an organization in the marketplace.

The resource person began by defining creative thinking as the ability to conceive new and innovative ideas by breaking away from established patterns and norms. Emphasized its role in fostering innovation, improving problem-solving capabilities, and driving personal and professional growth.

Principles of Creative Thinking:

Divergent Thinking: Generating multiple ideas and solutions for a given problem.

Convergent Thinking: Narrowing down ideas to find the most effective solution.

Lateral Thinking: Approaching problems indirectly and creatively.

Techniques to Enhance Creative Thinking:

Brainstorming: Encouraging free-flowing ideas without immediate judgment or evaluation.

Mind Mapping: Visualizing ideas and their connections to stimulate creative thinking.

SCAMPER: A technique that involves asking questions to transform existing ideas (Substitute, Combine, Adapt, Modify, Put to another use, Eliminate, Reverse).

Role-Playing: Putting oneself in others' shoes to gain different perspectives.

Barriers to Creative Thinking:

Fear of Failure: Reluctance to take risks due to the fear of making mistakes.

Fixed Mindset: Believing that abilities and intelligence are static.

Environmental Constraints: Lack of resources, restrictive policies, and unsupportive culture.

Conformity Pressure: Pressure to adhere to established norms and practices.

Fostering a Creative Environment:

Encouraging Curiosity: Creating a culture where questions and exploration are valued.

Providing Autonomy: Allowing individuals the freedom to experiment and take risks.

Diverse Teams: Building teams with diverse backgrounds and perspectives to enhance idea generation.

Supportive Leadership: Leaders should encourage and support creative efforts, providing the necessary resources and removing obstacles.

Applications of Creative Thinking:

1. Business: Developing innovative products and services, improving processes, and creating compelling marketing strategies.
2. Education: Designing engaging curricula and teaching methods to foster students' creativity.

Purpose:

In today's fast-paced economy, effective speaking skills are crucial for success in studies and employment.

This program is meticulously designed to empower students with necessary knowledge and to build proficiency for success in academic endeavors.

Focus:

- Primary Intention is to help students to communicate their thoughts and ideas clearly.
- The FDP was organized by Cambridge through Naan Mudhalvan at UNOM for two days on 22 and 23rd of January 2024.
- The two training enhanced the how the teacher should play a vital role to serve as mentors and guides and they should provide knowledge, feedback, and support to develop effective speaking skills.
- They should act as facilitators of learning, helping students build confidence and refine their communication abilities through personalized guidance and provide them feedback.
- The Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) is an international scale for assessing language ability. The CEFR is language neutral so you can use it no matter what language you're learning. And it's easy for both educators and learners to use — to assess someone's level you just need to check some can-do statements.

For example, if Student A can understand and use only familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases, they are level A1. It can be that simple.

Originally people used the CEFR language proficiency levels to assess European language ability but nowadays people all over the world use the CEFR to assess language skills in any language.

What are the language proficiency levels?

The CEFR breaks language ability down into 6 levels.

The 6 CEFR levels

Basic user A1 A2

Independent user B1B2

Proficient user C1 C2

Focus areas and development of speaking skills in the programme

This programme primarily focuses on the development of the following skills:

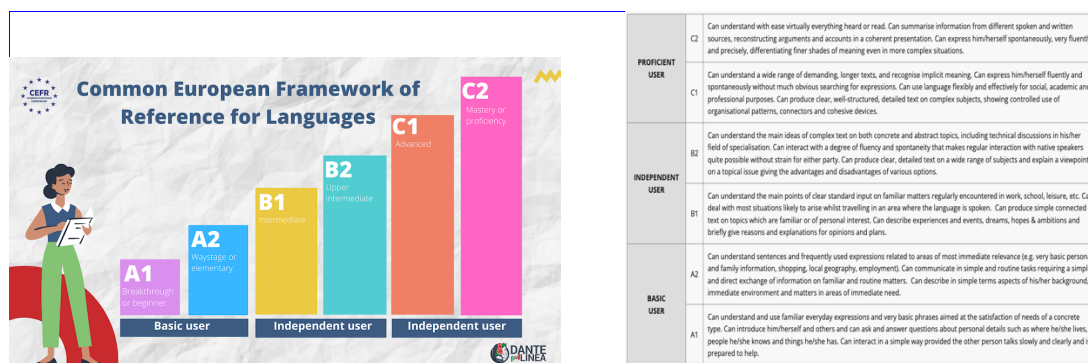
- Fluency: communicate Effectively
- Developing fluency in spoken communication can enhance relationships, boost career performance, and improve one's ability to communicate ideas and thoughts in general.
- Pronunciation: Two Elements: Intelligibility and Intonation.
- Intelligibility ensures that words are articulated clearly.
- Easy to understand by the listeners.
- Intonation: Encompasses the rise and fall of the pitch in speech, imparting meaning and emotions to words and sentences.
- Vocabulary: Appropriate vocabulary selection is crucial for effective communication. Choosing the right words of the choices is necessary to enhance the clarity of the message with the context.

Formal Audience- professional language

Choosing the right vocabulary illustrates the significance of the context.

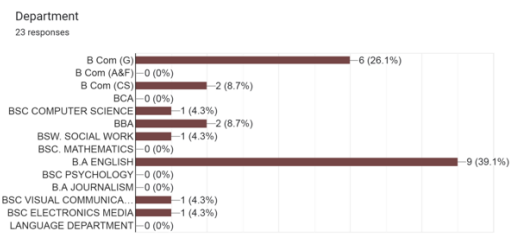

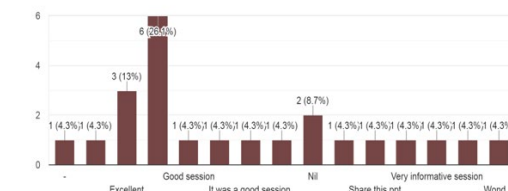

Peer Mentoring Report: Technical Editing

Objective

To evaluate the effectiveness of peer mentoring in enhancing technical editing skills among participants.

Outcomes

1. Improved editing accuracy
2. Enhanced collaboration
3. Increased confidence in Technical Writing
4. Skill development in Copy Editing and better technical editing skills.
5. Knowledge sharing: 88% reported learning from peers.
6. Recognize peer mentoring skills of students

Methodology

1. Students underwent weeks of training from Ivesta Technologies. These students were selected after a written test and personal interview.
2. 6-week peer mentoring program with weekly sessions were conducted via Skype. The students who participated were Zebloun Mathew, Bettina K B, Gayathri, and Ajay Vidyasagar or II M.A. English
3. Mentee-mentor training was given to the students of II and I M.A. English.
4. The following topics were held. Introduction to technical editing, Grammar and syntax, Style guides and formatting, and advance techniques.

The PG Department of English at Patrician College of Arts and Science successfully organized a Peer Mentoring Session on **Technical Editing** on **March 1, 2024**, at **11:30 a.m.** in **Room No. 95**.
