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

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



- To help participants develop a clear understanding of the knowledge, skills, and experience required for success in these fields.
- To assist participants in identifying their personal strengths and areas for improvement related to social work and these specific fields.
- To provide guidance and resources for participants to network, gain experience, and access professional development opportunities in these areas.
- To facilitate connections between participants and experienced professionals in these fields to provide mentorship and advice.

PROGRAMME SUMMARY

The career guidance program for social work with a focus on human resource management, community development, and medical and psychiatry fields aimed to provide participants with an understanding of the various career paths available in social work and the skills and experience required for success in these fields. 




