Objective:

It was established on 12 April 1988 as an executive body and was given statutory powers on 30 January 1992 through the SEBI Act, 1992. In the year 1992, Securities and exchange Board of India (SEBI) Act was passed. The objectives of SEBI are - to protect the interest of investors in securities and to promote the development of and to regulate the securities market.

Report:

The students were briefed on SEBI's mandate to regulate the securities market and protect the interests of investors, ensuring transparency, fairness, and efficiency in the capital markets.


Outcome:




Outcome of the programme:


