The UBA class coordinators were given training on participatory rural appraisal which included detailed understanding in Transect walk, Social Mapping VENN diagram, Problem Tree Analysis, Focus Group discussion and social survey.

Each village undertook household surveys and village surveys in their respective adopted villages for a period of 3 months. During these surveys they understood various the demographic details of the community, infrastructure facilities of the communities and the problems and concerns of the people. The students were trained in the participatory rural appraisal techniques to find out the challenges faced by the people in the community.

The care and share program during the month of Christmas was celebrated in all the villages on 16th December 2023 by spreading the message of care and share among the community. Various cultural events and games were organised by the students for the community children, women, youth and elderly. Winners were given prizes and Santa Claus distributed sweets to the children. An awareness program on importance of girl child education and gender equity was conducted on 26th January 2023 with a community pledge to safeguard the rights of the girl child.


An awareness program on road safety to highlight the effects of rash driving and accidents was staged through a mime by our students in Uthandi village on 2nd March 2023.


